IRISH WHISKEY AND DISTILLERIES

Irish Whiskey, from the Gaelic term 'uisce beatha' (ishka baa-ha) meaning 'water of life', is one of Europe's earliest distilled beverages. The first record of Irish whiskey dates back to 1405, almost 100 years before it was recorded in Scottish history.

Irish Whiskey was the most widely consumed spirit globally in the latter part of the 19th century, with over 88 licensed distilleries in Ireland at that time. Following a period of decline during the 20th century, Irish whiskey is now experiencing an exciting rebirth. With several new visitor distilleries and more in final stages of development, now is the time to experience the world's fastest growing premium spirit.

DRINK A DROP OF DUBLIN

You can't visit Dublin without sampling Guinness. The Guinness Storehouse, located beside the famous brewery at St James' Gate, wraps several floors of exhibitions and advertising displays around a pint shaped atrium. Or enjoy a drop of whiskey at one of our famous distilleries Jameson, Teelings, Dublin Liberties or Pearse Lyons where you can learn about the distilling process before taking a tutored sup of the nectar itself. Sláinte!

HOP ON A DUBLIN TOUR

Exploring Dublin is a beautiful thing; that's why the Hop-on/Hop-off tours offered by Dublin Bus, City Sightseeing and Big Bus are such a good idea! Stopping at multiple attractions around the city, visitors are free to hop on and off at their leisure. You can also visit Dublin's coasts and castles on a number of the tours.



MATCH FEVER

When it comes to hurling and Gaelic football, two field sports unique to Ireland, all roads lead to Croke Park. Championship finals at the spectacular 82,300-seater stadium are electrifying and tickets tend to be scarce, but you can relive the glory with the captivating Croke Park Experience in the Gaelic Athletic Association (GAA) Museum. Test your sporting prowess while you're there and finish up with a walk along the 17-storey-high Skyline. Whatever you do, don't look down! If rugby or soccer is more your pitch, the spanking new Aviva

Stadium with its iconic curvilinear roof won't disappoint. A behind-the-scenes-tour will serve up some dazzling views and a taste of the match experience.

POP INTO A PUB

"In Dublin, you're never more than 20 paces from a pint," remarked JP Dunleavy, author of "The Gingerman". Today you are, typically, also within strolling distance of a range of award-winning gastropubs which provide excellent food and the odd session of trad Irish music. On the traditional front, several pubs around the city, like The Brazen Head, Oliver St John Gogartys, O' Donoghue's, O'Shea's Merchant Pub and The Cobblestone, put on traditional Irish music sessions and many of them are free. The Merry Ploughboy Pub, Johnnie Foxes in the Dublin Mountains and the Irish House Party all offer traditional food and shows with live music, song and dance. Craft beer officienados will be delighted with the range of local craft beers available widely across Dublin. Why not take a microbrewery tour before you join the locals and enjoy the ambience of Urban Brewing or The Camden's (Five Lamps Brewery).



CITY BY THE SEA

A short ride on the DART light rail is all it takes to access a selection of relaxed seaside villages and beaches. Within half an hour of leaving the city, you can be in a boat on your way to Dalkey Island, eating Michelin-starred food in Malahide, walking the Victorian pier

at Dun Laoghaire, or devouring snap-fresh seafood in Howth or Skerries. Dublin Coastal Trail will guide you along our UNESCO Biosphere Bay- For an exhiliarating way to find out and experience it check out Dublin Under Sail under the red cloth sails of the 'Brian Boru' - get to grips with ropes, sails and fellow crew members as you harness the wind to power the traditional sailing vessel of the 'Brian Boru'.

This intimate guided tour brings you on a journey from the house's grand Georgian beginnings to the tenement dwellings of its later years.

Discover the Irish diaspora and their emigration to other countries at Epic The Irish Emigration Musem. Uncover the story of our emigrants and how they shaped the world, you'll realise that emigration is not about what people leave behind, but what they bring with them.
